- 2. Holds a high school certificate with the advanced track or technical secondary from a technological institute.
- 3. A recent graduate and must not have graduated for more than one year upon the application.

Profile of the Marine Pilot Program

• Program Guide

The Marine Pilot Program is concerned with the education of UAE cadres who pledge to serve as maritime officers for all kinds of ships and navigational vessels through studying nautical science and graduating as a Navigation (Deck) officer.

Marine Pilot responsibilities and the Nature of Work

- The Marine Pilot and the quality of his performance is an equivalent to the quality and efficiency
 of the port he is serving. His performance has a major role in maintaining a good reputation of
 the port locally and internationally.
- The pilot on duty must always be at the port's locomotives, docks, and cargo areas where longshoremen are loading and unloading the ships.
- The pilot directs the vessel as soon as it arrives at the port's canal and must guide them until the
 vessel has completely moored alongside berth. The same work is applied when the vessel leaves
 the port.

The Technical Competencies of a Pilot

The Marine Pilot must have a high-level of technical skills to perform his duty well. Such technical skills include, but not limited to the following:

- The ability to efficiently and effectively manage the guidance process. Such skill must be based on scientific and academic knowledge, specialized technical training, and actual practical experience (sea hours).
- The ability to adapt to all the requirements and specificities as required by different types of navigational vessels.
- The Pilot has a full knowledge of international and national Marine laws and regulations.
- The Pilot must be knowledgeable about the extension area or seaport and how it operates in all aspects such as the current conditions, shallow spaces, harbor corners and dark corners of safety

navigation, geographical boundaries, geological nature, tidal times, depth of sidewalks and other matters associated with the extension area or seaport.

- He must be able to read and interpret various navigational maps and to monitor and read
 navigation equipments and radar screens using all the apparatus on the deck and in the control
 tower.
- He has the knowledge and he is familiar with all regulations, standards, requirements, and laws related to occupational and environmental health and safety, and other ways of preventive measures.

The Behavioral Competence of a Pilot

The responsibilities of a pilot can be stressful, thus he must observe with distinct behavioral competencies including, but not limited to:

- The ability to accept all the responsibilities resulting from his decisions for the tasks entrusted to him.
- The ability to deal effectively with problems.
- The ability to ensure the safety of the navigational vessel and the infrastructures at the port he is serving.
- The ability to properly use the resources, instruments, and equipment provided to him, whether it may be on board, in the control tower or at the port.
- The ability to prioritize, manage crises and manage risks.
- The ability to focus and maintaining emotional stability in overcoming difficulties and obstacles in his work, while finding appropriate solutions according to the possibilities and resources available to him.
- The ability to communicate effectively and skillfully with different teams and various kinds of people at work.
- The ability to work in a team to achieve the goal of his job and the port he is serving.
